**Course Description:** This course is designed to be an introduction for students planning to take higher level anatomy and physiology courses. The course will include a wide range of topics associated with the human body and human life. This course, with the associated lab, will fulfill the lab science requirements for the student planning a non-science major.

**Unit Objectives:** Students successfully completing this course will demonstrate an understanding of the structure and function of the human body as well as a basic understanding of homeostatic mechanisms. The students will also become familiar with various life processes including digestion, reproduction, and cardiovascular circulation.

**Active Learning:** In addition to educational strategies such as reading, listening, and reflecting, when appropriate this class makes use of learning techniques commonly known as active learning. Students should expect to participate in active learning techniques such as discussions and presentations, small group activities, writing, problem-solving, movement, case studies, role-playing, etc. These activities promote analysis, synthesis, and evaluation of class content in order to improve student learning outcomes.

**Assessment Methods:** Student achievement will be assessed by exams. You will take fifteen exams over the course of this semester. All exam dates will be announced, in class, at least one day before the exam. **The final exam in this class is optional**. The final exam will only help people who are equal to, or less than, one percentage point away from the next letter grade. For instance, if your overall percentage is 77, you are clearly more than one percentage point away from 80%. You would not be eligible for the final exam. A 79% would be eligible to take the final exam.

**Grading:** Final grades will be based on exam scores. Letter grades will be distributed according to the following scale:

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A 100% - 90.0
B 89.0 - 80.0
C 79.0 - 70.0
D 69.0 - 50.0
F 59.0% or less
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**Attendance:** Attendance, while strongly encouraged, is not required. Regular attendance will help your overall grade. Please bring your text to class. It will be handy to reference figures, tables, etc.

**Makeup:** There will be no make-up exams, except for college sponsored events. You will always drop your lowest exam score for final grading purposes. Therefore, everybody gets to skip one exam.
