**Course Description:** This course is designed to be an introduction for students planning to take higher level anatomy and physiology courses. The course will include a wide range of topics associated with the human body.

**Unit Objectives:** Students successfully completing this course will demonstrate an understanding of the structure and function of the human body as well as a basic understanding of homeostatic mechanisms. The students will also become familiar with several organ systems including digestive, urinary, reproductive, skeletal, muscular, nervous, and cardiovascular.

**Active Learning:** In addition to educational strategies such as reading, listening, and reflecting, when appropriate this class makes use of learning techniques commonly known as active learning. Students should expect to participate in active learning techniques such as discussions, small group activities, writing, problem-solving, case studies, etc. These activities promote analysis, synthesis, and evaluation of class content in order to improve student learning outcomes.

Assessment Methods: There will be a quiz at the end of each chapter. There will be exams every 3-4 chapters for a total of FOUR exams given during the semester. There will also be a cumulative final exam during finals week. All questions will be objective (multiple choice, matching, fill-in-the-blank, and/or short answer). If, for ANY reason, you have to leave the classroom during a test, you MUST turn in your exam. You will NOT be permitted to return and complete it.

In addition, there may be various assignments and unannounced quizzes given throughout the semester.

A grade of zero will be recorded for any exam or other assignment that is missed. Missed assignments, quizzes, and exams CANNOT be made up except for extraordinary, proven circumstances such as a medical issue (complete with a doctor's note) or a funeral (with a funeral program provided to the instructor upon return). I need to be contacted **PRIOR** to the regular exam or as soon as possible afterwards to receive consideration.

I understand that sometimes ordinary circumstances may cause you to miss an exam or quiz. To compensate for those instances, I will be dropping your lowest quiz score and your lowest regular exam score from your final grade. Therefore, the zero you would get from missing one quiz or one exam will not affect your final grade.

**Grading:** The final grade for this course will be determined as follows:

A (90-100%) B (80-89%) C (70-79%) D (60-69%) F (<60%)

I do round up to whole percentages so an 89.5% is the lowest possible score to receive an A and so forth.

DO NOT email me to ask about or discuss your grade. BSC policy prevents me from discussing grades over the phone or email. That can only be done in person and you are welcome to visit me during office hours or make an appointment at another time to do so. I keep your grades updated in Blackboard so you can figure out your current grade and do your own math and figure out "how many points you need to get a certain grade."

If you do miss a class, it is your responsibility to contact me or a fellow classmate to find out what you have missed so you do not fall behind.
